

EAST FARNDON QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE COMMITTEE

Constitution

1. The Committee is a Village Community Group, with the Committee taking and implementing all decisions, including approach, activities and finances.
2. In general correspondence, the name can be shortened to the Jubilee Committee.
3. The Committee is co-chaired by Caroline Burton and Mervyn Curtis, with the chairs being replaced at any time by a majority vote of the Committee members.
4. The Committee comprises a group of community volunteers; the current members are listed below.
5. Committee members can co-opt further volunteers to help manage the set up and running of activities for Jubilee events.
6. Regular Committee review meetings will take place and a full record of finances will be kept continuously up to date.
7. The Committee is coordinated by the Parish Council, who hold the overall responsibility for the Jubilee celebrations. This allows the Committee to be supported by the Parish Council in terms of insurance, event licencing and advice and guidance on financial matters, including using the Parish Council bank account for cash flow purposes.

Aims

1. To bring the village of East Farndon together
2. To celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in a family-oriented, fun, safe & secure, and eco-friendly way
3. To raise money for local charities

Objectives

1. To organise memorable family-friendly events to mark the historic occasion of the Platinum Jubilee.
2. To include within the events, a focus on the children of East Farndon by providing a free of charge Jubilee Picnic lunch and a celebratory gift.
3. To facilitate the involvement and support across all East Farndon village organisations, including the Church, Village Hall, the Amenity Land Trust and United Charities.
4. To, as a minimum, cover all costs for the Jubilee events from donations and profits made from the event itself.
5. To donate any profits to East Farndon Parochial Church Council, The Amenity Land Trust and the Jubilee Foodbank.
6. If profits allow, create a physical legacy (either an object for the village or a meaningful charitable donation for those in need), in addition to the planting of a tree.
7. To leave a legacy of fond memories of the village celebration of a unique Jubilee.
